Band of Hope



11.110A WM 35.5 (P)

An open book reads HOLY BIBLE with HOLD THOU ME UP AND I SHALL BE SAFE beneath (five lines), a dove above with THE BIBLE and OUR GUIDE above and below respectively (both curved). A wide border reads ★ IF SINNERS ENTICE THEE ★ CONSENT THOU NOT around.

┌ A laurel wreath entwined with three small banners that read HEALTH COMFORT HAPPINESS respectively, clasped hands in the field above with PLEDGE BY DIVINE ASSISTANCE I SHALL ABSTAIN FROM ALL INTOXICATING DRINKS (seven lines) beneath.

CF

Pierced for simple loop suspension, with a printed light blue ribbon that reads ESPLAND HILL and BAND OF HOPE (five lines, with the 3rd and 5th curved on printed banners). Espland Hill is a small hamlet north of Appleby.

BARROW-IN-FURNESS

George Dunn (Coal Dealer)

Although not evident from the token, Roose or Roosecote is a suburb of Barrow-in-Furness, once served by a railway station on the Furness Line. The issuer, George Dunn, was b. 30 Oct 1875 at Dalton-in-Furness, and d. 21 Sep 1962 in Seattle, USA.

GEORGE DUNN around above and ROOSE below, with COAL DEALER (two lines) across the field.

Similar to 10.50, but with an slightly angled D and crudely stamped ½ added.

A copper flan with an inset central brass disc. The copper is engraved V S & M (Vickers Son & Maxim) COMMERCIAL STAFFS WALKING CONTEST, and the brass insert displays two male walking contestants left.

℞ A laurel wreath engraved with details of the recipient and event, including Barrow, 1903.

This medal was awarded to Reverend Christopher William Wordsworth (1879-1965) who was the great-grandson of the poet, William Wordsworth.

17.7B AR 35 x 41

A batsman at the crease, bat aloft, within a linear circle. This on an inverted triangular-shaped base with ornamental edges and scrollwork around. Two cricket bats with handles crossed form the suspension lug.

℞ A plain reverse engraved with details of the recipient and event, including VICKERSTOWN CRICKET CLUB, 1904. Hallmarked.

A rectangular flan with crowned conjoined busts of the king and queen left inside laurel leaves, with TO COMMEMORATE and ornaments above (two lines) and THE CORONATION and ornaments below (two lines). Traces of blue enamel beneath the inscriptions. Rope-effect BB.

℞ Divided horizontally into three unequal sections. The upper part has an angular version of the Barrow-in-Furness arms with ornaments and JUNE 1911 each side, BARROW CORONATION SPORTS (three lines) across the central part, and T.F. BUTLER JP DL MAYOR (two lines) and hallmarks below. BB as obverse.

Complete with a moulded suspension loop.

A bird with three pellets above, its wings spread intersecting a blue circular band inscribed BOWNESS WELCOME HOME TO SOLDIERS & SAILORS. This on a shield bearing the arms of Carlisle in red, green, white and blue, with a laurel background. The border around is irregular, and the upper part is formed into an ornate suspension lug.

℞ PRESENTED (curved) TO (two lines), then space for insertion of the recipient's name, FOR HIS SERVICE TO HIS COUNTRY • IN THE • GREAT WAR 1914-19 (five lines). Hallmarked.

A metal-detector find from near Sedbergh, found together with two other similar items in the near vicinity. The location of the finds was once farmed by the Wilkinson family in the 17th-19th centuries to which the initials may relate.

Uppercase initials I W within a crude toothed border.

r A central device, possibly a merchant's mark, that could represent a set of scales or a fleur-de-lis, with a vague animal shape above. A heavily toothed border similar to the obverse AN(3)

20.105 Bs 30 (P)

Crudely stamped PEGGY OF ULVERSTON (three lines) across the field.

r Crudely stamped PEGGY ! MY ! HEART ! around.

Coach & Horses

An metal-detector find from South Cumbria, where local public houses of that name are known in Askham, Barrow and Dalton. Further research is needed, although a contemporary grocer by the name William Oldfield is noted at Ulverston in 1882.

r The reverse design is unclear, although incuse inscriptions W. OLDFIELD and COACH & HORSES respectively are curved above and below a figure 2 in the field.
